

GOYA Rules of Conduct at Social Events

I. Music

- A. A written contract will be prepared and signed between the Band/DJ and the hosting Church/Community. This will be discussed, signed, and fully agreed to prior to the scheduled event
- B. No profane language, curse words or swear words will be used.
- C. No suggestive dance themes will be permitted
- D. Specific songs/music will be listed, if possible.

II. Attire

- A. Three categories of clothing will be used, depending on the particular event:
 - i. Casual
 - a) School clothes: jeans and sneakers
 - ii. Church Clothes
 - a) Dress shirts, ties and shoes for men.
 - b) Dresses, skirts, dress shirts, dress pants, and shoes for women.
 - iii. Semi-Formal
 - a) Attire worn for formal occasions such as 'Mr. and Miss Junior Goya.'
- B. In **no** event will midriff or halter tops, short-shorts, cut-offs, or bare feet be permitted.
- C. Any youth participant arriving at the point of departure, dressed improperly, will be sent home (immediately) by the Youth advisors.

III. Dancing

- A. Unacceptable dance behavior will not be tolerated. This includes: provocative, promiscuous, and suggestive dancing.

IV. Lighting

- A. Lighting will be regulated somewhere between very bright and very dark.

V. Enforcement

- A. Three warnings will be given for infractions of the Rules of Conduct:
 - i. First warning: the Youth Advisor and Priest in charge of respective GOYAN are told about the disciplinary incident.
 - ii. Second warning constitutes removal of involved GOYAN from the floor. They will be held under responsibility of Youth Advisor until end of event.
 - iii. Third warning is same as second; in addition, GOYAN will not be allowed to attend next social function at District or State level.

VI. Communication

- A. Prior to all social functions, the Rules of Conduct will be highlighted and announced. The three warnings will be explained explicitly.
- B. Priests, Youth Advisors, and Parents must be kept informed of the actions of all GOYANS, at all times.
